Matthew 28:19–20 "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen.

Luke 10:25-29

And behold, a certain lawyer stood up and tested Him, saying, "Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?" He said to him, "What is written in the law? What is your reading of it?" So he answered and said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind,' and 'your neighbor as yourself." He said to him, "You have answered rightly; do this, and you will live." But he, wanting to justify himself, said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"



Who Is My Neighbor?

When we hear the great commission, as Christians, our response should be as Isaiah's: "Here I am! Send me!" Instead, we often see all the obstacles between us and some distant mission field -I'm still a student: I don't have the funding; I'm not good at public speaking; I have health issues that would prevent that kind of travel; etc. The response to this would be simply that God equips the called. If He is calling you to go abroad for missions, He will give you the means to do so. But some "obstacles" are given to us as an indication that our mission field is closer to home.

When the lawyer in Luke 10 asks, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus responds with the parable of the good Samaritan and asks who the injured man's neighbor was, the lawyer replies that it was the one who showed him mercy, and Jesus tells him, "Go and do likewise."

When you find yourself delayed from pursuing missions in the farflung corners of the world. remember that we also are instructed to love our neighbors. Your mission field may be your classroom, the break room at work, or even the line at the grocery store. Remember that while Missouri may have been your home your whole life, it is immensely far away from the people and places where and to whom Jesus gave the original commission. Our nation is one of many in desperate need of the Savior. Who is your neighbor? How can you share the love and mercy of God with them? What's stopping you today?

Protection of His Presence

Psalm 91:1-9 - He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the Lord, "He is my refuge and my fortress; my God, in Him I will trust." Surely He shall deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the perilous pestilence. He shall cover you with His feathers, and under His wings you shall take refuge; His truth shall be your shield and buckler. You shall not be afraid of the terror by night, nor of the arrow that flies by day, nor of the pestilence that walks in darkness, nor of the destruction that lays waste at noonday. A thousand may fall at your side, and ten thousand at your right hand; but it shall not come near you. Only with your eyes shall you look and see the reward of the wicked. Because you have made the Lord, who is my refuge, even the Most High, your dwelling place...

On Easter Sunday, Pastor McCubbin preached about people who go into protection mode and attempt to control every aspect of their lives. Like mother hens, they will try to keep everything near and in sight so they can guide, shelter, or protect as they see fit. They may even attempt to control or manipulate God. The psalmist tells us that this could not be further from the natural order of how things should be. Instead of corralling all of our concerns, squawking over our problems, and hunkering down in an attempt to shield all that we value most, we are the ones who are supposed to accept the shielding power of the Almighty. In his book *Prayer, Praise & Promises: A Daily Walk Through the Psalms*, Warren Wiersbe states, "I wonder what the safest place in the world is. A bomb shelter? A bank vault? Perhaps a prison surrounded by an army? According to Psalm 91, the safest place in the world is a shadow." Where is your dwelling place? Are you trusting in the protective presence of the Most High? Do you know the calm and comfort of His shadow, or are you trying to control the outcomes in your life?


